Alyssa Almonti is the Residence Manager at Bloom for Women, where she brings both professional expertise and lived experience to her leadership role. A survivor-leader and former Bloom program participant, Alyssa embodies the mission of Bloom and is deeply committed to creating safe, healing, and empowering environments for women on their journey to independence.

Alyssa holds a Bachelor of Social Work from Kutztown University and is a trained facilitator in both Moral Recognition Therapy and the Ending the Game curriculum. She also serves as Board Chair of the Lehigh Valley Anti-Trafficking Week Collaborative, a multi-agency initiative dedicated to raising awareness and mobilizing community action against human trafficking.

As Bloom's Residence Manager, Alyssa oversees the intake screening and assessment process for new participants and manages all aspects of the residential program across Bloom's five homes. She supervises residential care staff, serves on-call for crisis situations, coordinates transportation to critical appointments, manages home maintenance and repairs, and ensures a safe, supportive, and trauma-informed environment for all participants, staff, and volunteers.

Previously, Alyssa served as a Case Manager at Bloom and worked as a Behavioral Health Technician at Pyramid Healthcare, where she supported individuals navigating recovery and mental health challenges.

Alyssa is a respected voice in the anti-trafficking movement and has been an invited speaker at both local and national conferences, sharing her story and advocating for survivor-centered care, prevention, and systemic change.

Through her leadership, compassion, and resilience, Alyssa continues to help build pathways of hope, healing, and opportunity for survivors across the Lehigh Valley and beyond.
