Drawing on both professional experience and lived experience, Alyssa is committed to fostering safe, healing, and empowering environments for women pursuing independence.

Alyssa holds a Bachelor of Social Work from Kutztown University and is trained in Moral Recognition Therapy and the Ending the Game curriculum. She also serves as Board Chair of the Lehigh Valley Anti-Trafficking Week Collaborative, a multi-agency initiative focused on raising awareness and strengthening community response to human trafficking.

In her leadership role, Alyssa oversees participant intake and assessment, supervises residential staff, coordinates crisis response, and manages daily operations across Bloom's residential homes. She also ensures trauma-informed practices are integrated throughout programming and support services.

Prior to her current role, Alyssa served as a Case Manager at Bloom and worked as a Behavioral Health Technician at Pyramid Healthcare, supporting individuals navigating recovery and mental health challenges. She is a respected voice in the anti-trafficking movement and has spoken at both local and national conferences on survivor-centered care and systemic change.
